COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Learn about the craft and publication process of writing for children from top authors, editors, and agents at the Oregon Society of Children's Book Writers and Illustrators' (SCBWI) Conference at the Shilo Inn Airport in Portland, Oregon on May 14-15, 2010. You must attend both days of the conference.

After you receive confirmation of registration, your second step is to register for credit with children's author Deb Lund at deb@deblund.com.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

As a result of taking this course, participants will learn:

- The process of writing and publishing children's literature
- Publishing trends in children's literature
- Writing tools and techniques
- Strategies for incorporating "real writing" in the classroom

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Following are general course requirements weighted for determining the granting of university quarter credit. Antioch University Seattle requires 75% or better to issue credit at the 400 level and 85% or better for credit at the 500 level.

1. Write a 2-3 page summary of the conference sessions you attended, stating how you can apply what you learned to your classroom situation.
- AND**
2. Depending on your preferences and professional situation, complete **at least one** of the following:
 - Write a manuscript for a children's book, incorporating information you learned at the conference.
 - Design lesson plans for a student writing activity based on one or more conference sessions.
- OR**
3. Another assignment of your own design with prior approval of the instructor

**18 CEU Hours equals 1.8 CEUs.

500 LEVEL ASSIGNMENT:

In addition to the 400 level assignment, complete **one** of the following:

4. Analyze five picture books or one children's novel with information you learned from the conference. Include a bibliography with title, author, publisher, and publication date. Your analysis may include, but is not limited to:
 - A summary and critique
 - Comments on the voice, plot, form, or other elements
 - Ideas for how you might use these books in your teaching situation

OR
5. Plan a fiction-writing unit that includes the following:
 - Idea generating activities
 - Story structure discussions
 - Revision strategies, including peer critiquing

OR
6. Another assignment of your own design with prior approval of the instructor

ASSIGNMENT FORMAT & DUE DATE:

- Papers should be word-processed in Word or a compatible program, and emailed to Deb Lund's email address as listed in this syllabus. Contact Deb if you need another option.
- All assignments are due to the instructor within two weeks of the end of the Conference.
